# WHAT IS CUI?

CUI is a term used to refer to categories of <u>unclassified information</u> that the Govt has determined requires "safeguarding or dissemination controls."

CUI replaces categories such as:

- Sensitive but Unclassified (SBU)
- For Official Use Only (FOUO)

# WHERE ARE CUI CATEGORIES LOCATED?

### CUI Registry (https://www.archives.gov/cui/registry/cui-glossary.html)

- Online repository for all information, guidance, policy, and requirements on handling CUI.
- Includes 18 main categories and approx. 2- 17 subcategories within each main category.

### The CUI Registry:

- identifies all approved CUI categories and subcategories,
- provides general descriptions for each,
- identifies the basis for controls,
- establishes markings, and
- includes guidance on handling procedures.

## **CUI Category: Controlled Technical Information**

### **Category Description:**

Controlled Technical Information means technical information with military or space application that is subject to controls on the access, use, reproduction, modification, performance, display, release, disclosure, or dissemination. Controlled technical information is to be marked with one of the distribution statements B through F, in accordance with Department of Defense Instruction 5230.24, "Distribution Statements of Technical Documents." The term does not include information that is lawfully publicly available without restrictions. "Technical Information" means technical data or computer software, as those terms are defined in Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement clause 252.227-7013, "Rights in Technical Data - Noncommercial Items" (48 CFR 252,227-7013). Examples of technical information include research and engineering data, engineering drawings, and associated lists, specifications, standards, process sheets, manuals, technical reports, technical orders, catalog-item identifications, data sets, studies and analyses and related information, and computer software executable code and source code.

Banner Format:

CUI//Category Marking//Limited Dissemination Control

### Marking Notes:

- Category Marking is optional when marking Basic CUI unless required by agency policy. Example: CUI//Limited Dissemination Control
- Category Marking preceded by "SP-" is required when marking Specified CUI. Example: CUI//SP-Category Marking//Limited Dissemination Control
- Whether CUI is Basic or Specified is determined by the applicable Safeguarding and/or Dissemination Authority for a given instance of CUI.
- Separate multiple Category Markings by a single forward slash (/) and list Category Markings alphabetically. Example: CUI//Category Marking A/Category Marking B//Limited Dissemination Control
- Category Markings for Specified CUI precede Category Markings for Basic CUI. Example: CUI//SP-Category Marking/Category Marking//Limited Dissemination Control
- Separate multiple Limited Dissemination Controls by a single forward slash (/). Example: CUI//Category Marking//Limited Dissemination Control/Limited Dissemination Control
- Reference 32 CFR 2002.20 A, CUI Marking Handbook A, Limited Dissemination Controls and individual agency policy for additional and specific marking guidelines.

National Institute of Standards & Technology (NIST)

- NIST promotes and maintains standards and encourages use and adherence to those standards.

# HOW ARE NIST & CUI RELATED?

NIST Special Publication 800-171 - "Protecting Controlled Unclassified Information in Nonfederal Systems and Organizations"

- Provides federal agencies with a set of recommended security requirements for protecting the confidentiality of CUI when such info resides in nonfederal systems.
- Security requirements apply to...nonfederal systems and organizations that process, store, or transmit CUI, or that provide security protection for such components.
- The security requirements are intended for use by federal agencies in contractual vehicles OR other agreements established between those agencies and nonfederal organizations.

# NIST & CUI CONT'D

NIST SP 800-171 provides guidance for implementing and complying with a specific federal regulation within the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS).

DFAR 252.204-7012 – Safeguarding Covered Defense Information and Cyber Incident Reporting

Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI) is referred to as bCovered Defense Information (CDI) under a defense contract.

# **CURRENT OSP PROCESS - OVERVIEW**

- 1. Identify any CUI requirements.
- 2. Discuss CUI applicability with UNM Researcher and funding agency.
- 3. If all parties agree that CUI will not be involved, OSP will attempt to have the DFAR clause removed from the contract. If unsuccessful, the UNM Researcher will sign an attestation form attesting to the non-involvement of CUI.
- 4. If all parties agree the CUI will be involved, the CUI Planning Team sets up a workshop (this workshop includes the PI and their local IT manager) to assess the PI's research environment with the goal of obtaining either:
  - a) an attestation from the PI that Controlled Defense Information (CDI) is not processed, stored, transmitted by the PI, or
  - b) a list of compliance gaps to be mitigated to achieve compliance, the parties responsible for completing that work, and the expected due dates.

# CUI AND PROPOSALS

CUI requirements are not **typically** seen at the proposal stage.

OSP is currently concerned with DFAR 252.2047012, but CUI can present itself in different manners.

There are a few instances in which DFAR 252.204-7012 may be present:

- Department of Defense proposals;
- Air Force proposals and other DoD Agencies;
- Other Federal proposals;
- Representations & Certifications (Reps & Certs)

Although CUI is not typically being seen at the proposal stage, OSP anticipates that there will be an increase of solicitations that have CUI over the next year as CUI compliance measures increase.

# IDENTIFYING CUI AT PROPOSAL STAGE

Alyssa Pierce will work closely with the Proposal Team & Contracts Team to:

- Provide training on identifying CUI requirements within proposals, solicitations, Reps & Certs, etc.;
- Review incoming proposals, solicitations, Reps & Certs, etc. for CUI requirements;
- Identify DFAR 252.204-7012 requirements;
- Collaborate with UNM Researcher and Contracts Team to ensure early awareness of CUI;
- Conduct ongoing weekly meetings with Contracts Team on current CUI reqs identified;

# WHAT IS YOUR ROLE WITH CUI?

- Be informed! Take advantage of reviewing available resources.
- Become familiar with CUI and the various categories and subcategories
   (CUI Registry https://www.archives.gov/cui/registry/cui-glossary.html)
- Become acclimated to key words and federal regulations: "controlled", "unclassified", "FAR",
   "CFR", "DFAR", and "AFFAR" that may be incorporated in solicitations
- Consistently review Reps & Certs as they pertain to your proposal.
- Utilize FRSO support, if needed the FRDO is an excellent resource!
